Our Rochdale Connect You

Aims/priorities: Applications must demonstrate how it will meet all 5 key criteria:



- Enabling – working with current or new community groups to quickly and easily support them
- Responding – to opportunities and gaps identified within communities
- Connecting – reaching and involving more community members as a result of the funding
- Targeting – specific groups such as, long term conditions, or areas agreed at neighbourhood level
- Building – adding value to your community though an essential ‘trade’ criteria where the receiving group are asked to offer a trade-off in a community contribution.

There are 5 priorities to bid against focused on fun, connecting people and ultimately improving lifestyles. These priorities have also been identified because they are centred on evidence based approaches which impact on the seed funding theme of improving wellbeing and reduce pressure on services:

- Arts and culture

- Walking and physical activity
- Growing and cooking
- Connect 5 / mental wellbeing
- Self-care / people supporting people around health conditions

Who can apply? The funding is for Rochdale Borough grassroots organisations, particularly emerging local groups as well as charities and other not-for-profit organisations whose focus is on local work (annual income under approx. £100,000).

Arts Council – Creative People and Places

Aims/priorities: The funding aims to support new and different approaches to developing cultural programmes that deliver excellent experiences, genuinely engage people in shaping provision and involve a variety of partners. The central aims of the fund are:



- Communities are empowered to take the lead in shaping local cultural provision
- More people from the identified places of least engagement experience, create and are inspired by arts and culture, and become regularly engaged as audiences or participants
- The aspiration of excellence is central to the activity we will support – this covers both excellence of art and culture and excellence of the process of engaging communities
- To learn from past experiences (including learning from the current Creative People and Places programme) and create an environment where the arts and cultural sector can experiment with innovative approaches to engaging communities
- To learn more about how to establish sustainable arts and cultural opportunities and make this learning freely available across the cultural sector
- To encourage partnerships across the subsidised, amateur, voluntary, and commercial sectors
- Through these projects, we will demonstrate the power of arts and culture to enrich the lives of individuals and make positive changes in communities
- Activity will be radically different from what has happened before in the eligible places prior to the Creative People and Places programme
- To maximise opportunities for collaborations across arts organisations, museums and libraries where possible

Projects working with children and young people of 18 years and under experiencing disadvantage through:

- Illness, distress, abuse or neglect

- Behavioural or psychological difficulties
- Living in poverty or situations of deprivation

Projects we fund make differences in children's lives that help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face. Projects achieve these differences by either working directly with children or seeking to improve their social and physical environments.

Who can apply? Not-for-profit organisations of any size that work with disadvantaged children and young people of 18 years and under who live in the UK, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands.

Happy Days Charity

Aims/priorities: The Happy Days Charity is a national children's charity dedicated to providing holidays, days out, and theatre trips for disadvantaged young people with special needs.
