Oldham Community Recovery Fund

Aims/priorities: We recognise community action is taking place across the Borough and we want to encourage and support this action and help to sustain and maintain our vibrant sector to support Oldham people during a very challenging time. GM Moving Oldham Local Pilot

Rochdale Community Response Fund - Equalities Focus

Aims/priorities: We recognise community action is taking place across the Rochdale Borough and we want to encourage and support this action. We are refocusing the Community Response Fund and introducing new priorities with an 'Equalities Focus' available for Rochdale Borough groups.

We are particularly interested in funding work that helps, connects or supports groups of people who are experiencing inequalities caused or worsened by the pandemic.

Early emerging evidence has shown that some groups are more affected than others and we will prioritise applications that support one or more of these groups.

- Older people
- Black Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) groups
- People who live in low-income areas or vulnerable settings
- The impact of other 'co-morbidities' (other underlying diseases)

Who can apply? Groups and organisations from the Voluntary, Community, Faith and Social Enterprise (VCFSE) sector. We are particularly interested in funding work that helps, connects or supports groups of people who are experiencing inequalities caused or worsened by the pandemic.

RBH Community Funding Grants 2020

Aims/priorities: Each year RBH makes grants of up to £5000 available for the benefit of our communities. We are able to award grants that enable the delivery of the following objectives:

- Work and Skills - help people to access employment opportunities and update their skills. E.g. weekly Job Club.
- Digital Inclusion - help people access and use digital technology.
- Financial Inclusion - help people to manage their money and make it go further. E.g. Pantry project or debt advice sessions.
- Health and Wellbeing - help increase peoples' health and wellbeing. E.g. Keep fit class, walking club, gardening club, health drop in sessions.
- Lessening social isolation. E.g. a mums and tots club, a luncheon club for older people, or a gardening club.
- Providing activities for children and young people. E.g. sport or homework clubs.
- Improving or developing a green space in your neighbourhood.
- Promoting mutuality across neighbourhoods - projects that bring different neighbourhoods and communities together in promoting RBH's Mutual values.

Your project must:

- Meet all current government guidelines around Covid-19
- Clearly demonstrate a benefit to RBH customers and/or communities
- Be completed (including all monitoring information requested by RBH) within 2 years of receipt of your grant
- Not have already started
- Be based entirely in Rochdale Borough: Rochdale, Middleton, Heywood, Milnrow and Littleborough. (Priority may be given to projects which address one or more neighbourhood priority as identified on RBH's neighbourhood action plans)

Places of Worship Reopening Fund

Aims/priorities: This funding is available for Rochdale Borough faith groups who are working towards reopening their place of worship and ensuring they can do so safely and following all of the recent government guidelines which have been released.

The fund is to help to ensure that places of worship are maintained to a level which is Covid-safe. This could help with additional cleaning, equipment, signage and collection of personal data.

Your application must show that your project meets one or more of the below criteria to apply for this fund:

- Making the place of worship safe - this could include help with risk assessments, additional cleaning, equipment, signage and setting up systems to collect personal data to support the NHS Test and Trace service.
- Engaging your community to raise awareness of the risk and symptoms of Coronavirus - this could include holding community engagement events/online webinars. Furthermore, overcoming barriers with those that are hard to engage and ensuring that they are aware of the local and national guidelines on how to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus
- Providing support in multiple languages - this could include educating the wider community on how to stay Covid-safe in their household, community or work place
- Training volunteers
 - to work with the local authority and public health to deliver outreach activities and educate the wider community and sign posting them to the appropriate support (e.g. how to get tested if a person develops Covid-19 symptoms)
- to engage with their community and identify risks and vulnerabilities which could have a detrimental impact on a family or community (e.g. unemployment, welfare support, mental health, dependencies, domestic abuse and other safeguarding vulnerabilities)

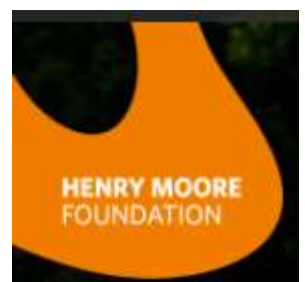
