Aims/priorities:	The Paul Hamlyn Foundation's (PHF's) mission is to "help people overcome disadvantage and lack of opportunity, so that they can realise their potential and enjoy fulfilling and creative lives". The Foundation places particular focus on supporting both young people and the arts. The funding is intended to support arts-based work that tackles the disruption caused by the coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic to education and the adverse impact on children and young

	people's mental health and wellbeing, particularly those experiencing systemic inequality and barriers to learning.

Applicants must be working in partnership with schools or other formal education settings, such as primary and secondary schools, further education colleges, alternative provision, special schools and early years.

Henry Smith Charity - Holiday Grants for Children		
Aims/priorities:	<p>In 2021, given the impact of coronavirus/COVID-19, the Charity has made some temporary changes to its guidelines to provide more flexibility on the types of trip it can support and is now funding day trips rather than residential holidays, with the aim of maximising the likelihood of trips going ahead.</p> <p>Applications can be made for grants towards a single or multiple day trips. Examples include theme parks, trips to adventure activity centres, the seaside, cultural centres such as museums, theatre performances or a sporting event.</p> <p>Eligible day trips should not involve a disproportionate amount of time spent travelling. Originally launched in 2016 as Bags of Help, the scheme has supported over 36,000 community groups with more than £85 million in grants. The scheme aims to make a positive difference – because where Tesco communities thrive, Tesco business and colleagues thrive too.</p>
Who can apply?	Not-for-profit organisations in the UK can apply if they are constituted and have a governing document.
Grant amount:	<p>Three projects in 575 local communities are voted on by customers in Tesco stores throughout the UK, with projects changing every three months. Three levels of grants are awarded with projects receiving:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First place (the most votes in its area) - a grant of up to £1,500. • Second place - a grant of up to £1,000. • Third place - a grant of up to £500.
