CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Paul Hamlyn Foundation

Aims/priorities: The Foundation places particular focus on supporting both young people and the arts. The Paul Hamlyn Foundation – Strategy 2015 identifies six strategic priorities relating to changes the PHF wishes to see in the UK. These are:

- To support imaginative people to nurture exciting ideas.
- To widen access and participation in the arts.
- To improve people's education and learning through the arts.
- To show that the arts make a difference to people's lives.
- To support the development and growth of organisations investing in young people and positive change.
- To improve support for young people who migrate, and strengthen integration so that communities can live well together.

The funding schemes offered by the PHF are designed to support innovation, give people a voice, work with others and make lasting commitments.

Who can apply? Not-for-profit formally constituted organisations are eligible to apply. Applicants that do not already have a track record in both the arts and work on access and participation must have a strong partnership that possesses such skills.

vInspire Cashpoint

Aims/priorities: To inspire and enable a new generation of social entrepreneurs to make a difference to the issues they care about. Grant recipients will be encouraged to use their creativity and initiative to develop and implement their own ideas, but will also be offered support and

guidance to help them build vital confidence and skills for business. **The current round is only for LGBT+ projects.**

vInspired Cashpoint will fund projects that:

- Are designed and run by 14-25 year old volunteers.
- Take place in England, Scotland or Northern Ireland.
- Can be delivered within two months.
- Clearly benefit a chosen community. This could be the community where the applicant lives or where they spend most of their time, or a group of people that the applicant would like to help.
- Are either **new** or an idea that has been used in the past but which the applicant would like to try again, doing things a bit differently.
- Create at least two **new** volunteering opportunities for 14 - 30 year olds (in addition to the applicant). Volunteers give their time to help others, other than just taking part in an activity; for example, coaching local children to play football is volunteering, but playing in a local football match is not volunteering.
- Cost less than £500 and vInspired cashpoint is the only funder.

Who can apply? Applications must come from individual young people between the ages of 14 and 30 years old who live in England, Scotland or Northern Ireland.

The Aviva Community Fund

Aims/priorities: Your project is right for the Aviva Community Fund if it:

- will make a positive difference in your community
- is associated with a community organisation or charity, and will take place in the UK
- will be completed or well underway before 31 December 2019
- can ideally be completed with the requested funding alone.

You can enter your project into one of these three categories:

1. Environment
2. Health & Wellbeing
3. Skills for Life

Who can apply? Not for profit community organisations or charities.

Grant amount: £1000 to £25000 (set at four different levels: £1000, £5000; £10000 and £25000)

Application process: Creating and submitting your project is easy. Just follow these four simple steps:

1. Identify a project that will have a positive impact in your community. You can submit a project for or on behalf of any not-for-profit community organisation.
2. Enter it in the Aviva Community Fund - you'll have to register on our site.
3. Add photos and videos to paint a better picture for the public.
4. Get your friends, family and more to vote for your project. Promote it by getting in touch with them, by using Facebook, Twitter, community events or any other way that will get attention.

Once voting opens on 23 October 2018, start sharing your project with as many friends, family and community supporters as possible to get their votes. The projects with the most votes will become finalists.

Viridor Credits – Main Grants Scheme

Aims/priorities: Viridor Credits Environmental Company is an independent company and Environmental Body set up to administer the Landfill Communities Fund (LCF) on behalf of Viridor Waste Management Projects under the Main Grants Scheme should address one or more of the following areas:

National Churches Trust – Cornerstone Grants Programme 2019 – 2013

Aims/priorities: The National Churches Trust supports church and chapel buildings open for worship throughout the UK. It funds urgent repairs and modernisation, provides expert advice on church maintenance and on how churches can continue to serve local communities and promote church heritage and tourism. The National Churches Trust has launched the first grant of its new grants programme in line with the Trust's new strategy for 2019-2023.

The funding is for projects which can demonstrate how they meet the outcome in line with the new strategy:

The Cornerstone Grants programme is intended to support structural repairs and maintenance issues costing more than £100,000 or the installation of kitchen and toilets costing over £30,000. Grants will cover up to 50% of the project cost.

Integrated Communities English Language Programme

Aims/priorities:

To help thousands of adults with low levels of English learn English so that they can 'reach their full potential through a wide range of local services including those provided by charities and other organisations'. Key characteristics of the programme's target learners will include:



- People with no or very little spoken English who would most benefit from pre-entry or entry level one support.
- People who evidence suggests are more likely to have poor English skills, in particular women.
- People who have been resident in the UK a minimum of 12 months.
- People not in employment and not actively seeking employment at this stage (ie those not generally eligible for other types of fully funded support to learn English).
- Adults – this programme is directed at those aged 19 and over.

Who can apply?

Local authorities, charities and other providers of language learning. Organisations, consortiums or partnerships that are capable of delivering services at scale may lead an application. The funder expects to fund a small number of national or regional providers who can develop a network of local delivery hubs in places with a high number of people from segregated communities with poor English skills.
